## EXPLANATORY NOTES AND DEFINITIONS

**Source:** The Statistics published in this report are primarily obtained from the Customs Warrants submitted to the Customs and Excise Department on the Importation and Exportation of Goods. These Warrants are coded and batched in the Trade Section of the Statistics Department before being processed by the same Department. This report is then prepared from the computer printout.

**Period Covered:** This report covers all documents relating to Trade brought into account during the Calendar Year, January - December, 2000 on a Quarterly basis.

**Trade Classification:** The classification of goods is based on the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC) Revised 3 issued by the United Nations Economic and Social Council. This system of classification has been in operation from April 1991 and replaces the second Revision, which came into effect in January 1981.

**System of Trade:** The "Special Trade" is the system of coverage in this report i.e.

- (a) Imports represent the total of all imports cleared by the Customs for the local economy, and excludes all imports remaining under the control of the Customs Authority in Bonded Warehouses.
- (b) Exports represent the exports of all Domestic Produce and the Re-export<sup>1</sup> of imported goods which have previously been cleared from Customs control for the local economy. Imported goods which are re-exported directly from bonded warehouses are excluded.

**Values:** All values are shown in Eastern Caribbean Dollars (EC\$). Imports are valued c.i.f. , i.e. the value, insurance, freight and incidental charges up to the time of delivery at the port.

Exports are valued f.o.b., i.e. the value includes charges up to the time of delivery on board the exporting vessel or aircraft.

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<sup>1</sup> Goods brought into the country for temporary use, with the intention to be returned or exported back to the country of origin.

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## **Analysis of Trade For the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2000 compared to 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 1999**

### **IMPORTS**

The value of Total Imports, for year 2000's second quarter, was eclipsed by the Total Imports value recorded in the first quarter of the year. The second quarter value of approximately 225 million EC Dollars was about 22 million EC Dollars short of the year's first quarter value. More interesting, however, is the slight decrease in the value of 2000's second quarter Total Imports, when compared with that value documented in the corresponding quarter of 1999. The total imports' value in the second quarter of 2000 was 0.2 percentage points lower than that value in the equivalent period of 1999.

For the year to date, January 2000 to June 2000, Total Imports was valued at about 472 million EC Dollars, representing an increase of 23 million EC Dollars over the value of Total Imports recorded in the corresponding period of 1999.

In the analysis of Total Imports by the SITC, the import category of Food and Live Animals regained its traditional position as the most significant contributor to Saint Lucia's imports. In the second quarter of 1999, the import class, Machinery and Transport Equipment (which then accounted for 22% of Total Imports), out performed the Food and Live Animals category. Conversely, for 2000's second quarter, Food and Live Animals comprised 21 percent of the quarter's total imports, while Machinery and Transport Equipment accounted for 20 percent. Furthermore, the value of the Food and Live Animals import class increased by 11 percentage points over that value recorded in the matching period of 1999. Other import categories making substantial contributions in the year's second quarter were Manufactured Goods Classified Chiefly by Material (19% of Total Imports) and Miscellaneous Manufactured Articles (14% of Total Imports). In addition to Food and Live Animals, imports of Beverages and Tobacco, Mineral Fuels, Lubricants and Related Materials and Chemicals and Related Products, N.E.S. increased in value, when comparing the second quarters of 2000 and 1999. Mineral Fuels, Lubricants and Related Materials recorded the largest import value increase of 24

percentage points. The largest import value decline was recorded in the SITC section, Commodities and Transactions Not Classified According to Kind.

Once again, Trinidad and Tobago captured the greatest share of CARICOM Imports, extending its second quarter contribution to CARICOM Imports from 67%, in 1999, to 68% in 2000. Trinidad and Tobago's closest competitor for CARICOM Imports, Barbados, with a CARICOM Imports' share of 13 percent, was unable to maintain 1999's second quarter contribution of 17 percent. Among the other major contributors to CARICOM Imports, Grenada, Guyana and Jamaica were all able to expand their second quarter shares of CARICOM Imports. However, Dominica's CARICOM Imports share suffered a moderate decline. Similar trends were recorded for the year-to-date period, January 2000 to June 2000. Trinidad and Tobago's year-to-date contribution to CARICOM Imports expanded from 64% in 1999 to 67% in 2000. Barbados' second quarter CARICOM Import share decline was also reflected in the year-to-date figures. That country's import contribution fell from 15% in 1999 to 12% in 2000, for the period January to June. Dominica's year-to-date CARICOM Imports share reveals a more significant contraction than that country's share of CARICOM Imports in 2000's second quarter. For the interval January to June, Dominica's contribution to CARICOM Imports decreased by 2 percentage points, between 1999 and 2000. Grenada, Guyana and Jamaica maintained their 1999 year-to-date contributions to CARICOM Imports and secured moderate import expansions for January to June 2000.

Outside of the region, the United States of America, with 51% of Extra-regional Imports in 2000's second quarter, sustained its long-established supremacy. For the same period, the United Kingdom and Japan, the United States' closest competitors for Extra-regional Imports, respectively captured 11% and 6% of imports from outside the CARICOM region. For the second quarter of 2000, the United States achieved a 39% share of Total Imports, increasing its Total Imports share, from the second quarter of 1999, by approximately one percentage point. Apart from the United States, most of year 2000's second quarter Total Imports came from Trinidad and Tobago, the United Kingdom, Japan and Canada. These countries respectively captured 16%, 9%, 5% and 3% of the quarter's Total Imports.

### IMPORTS 2ND QUARTER 2000 & 1999

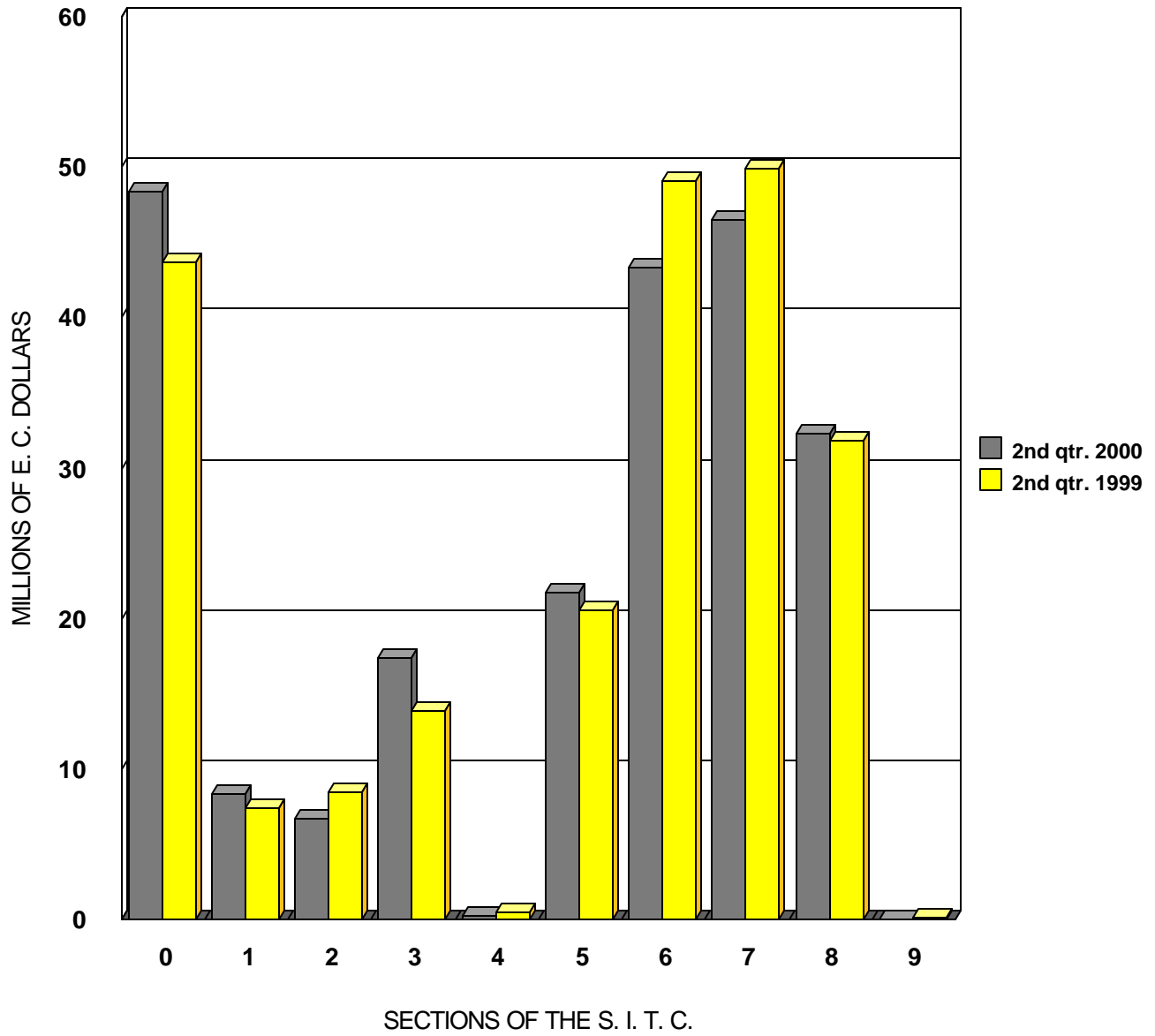

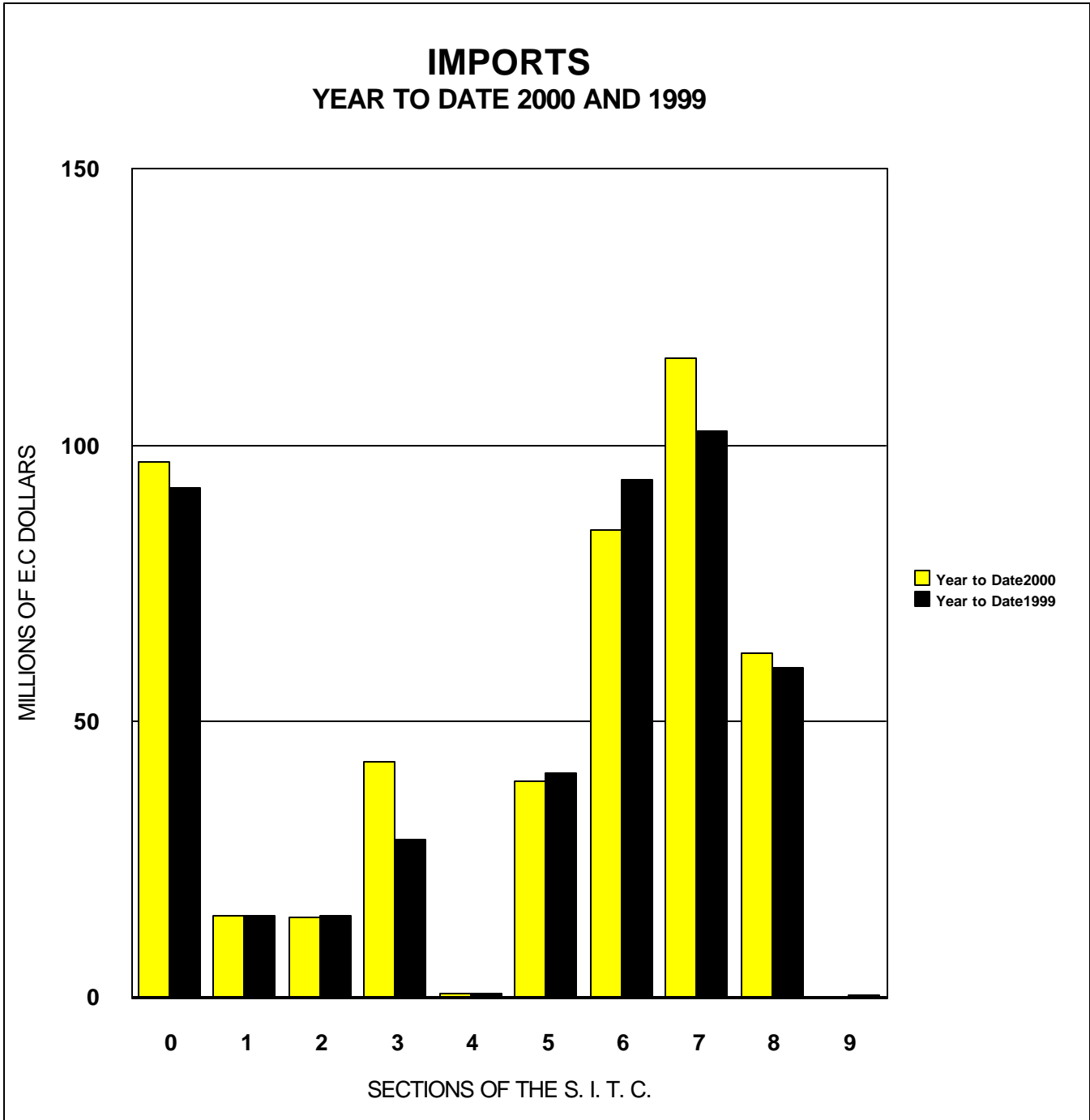

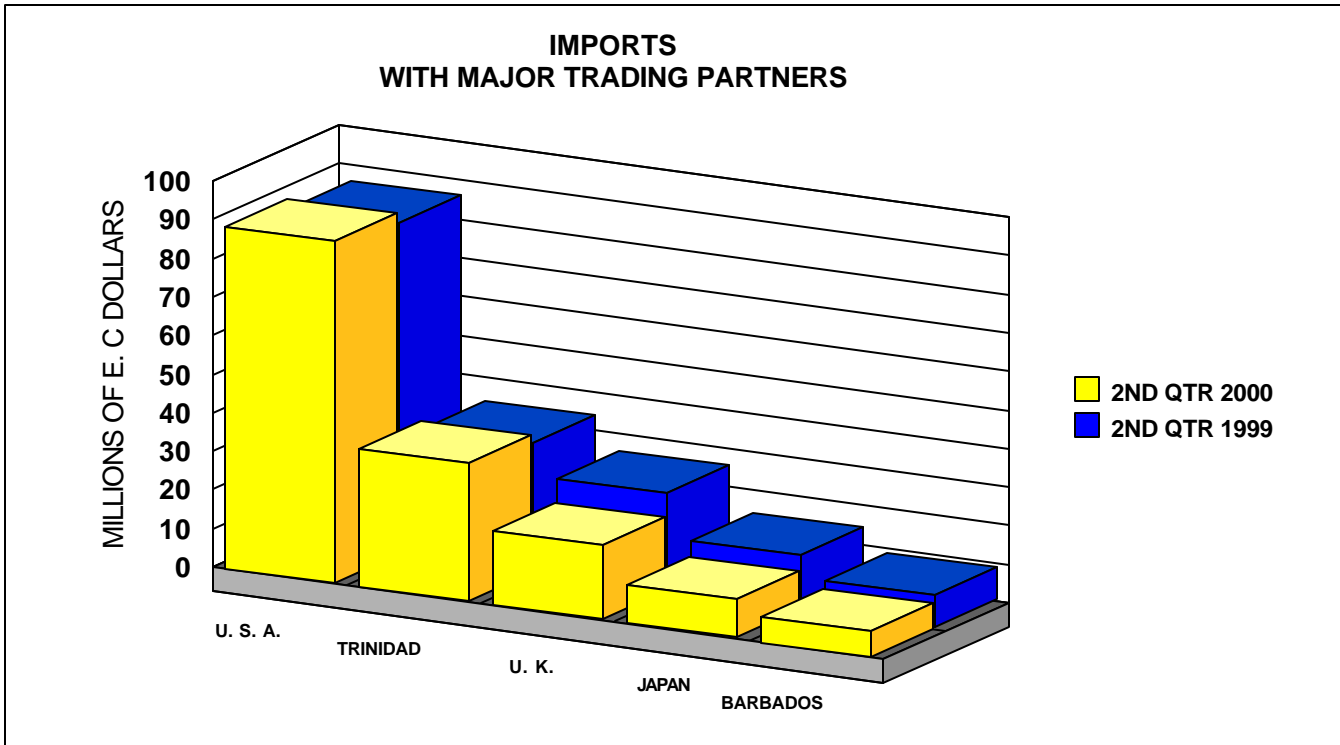

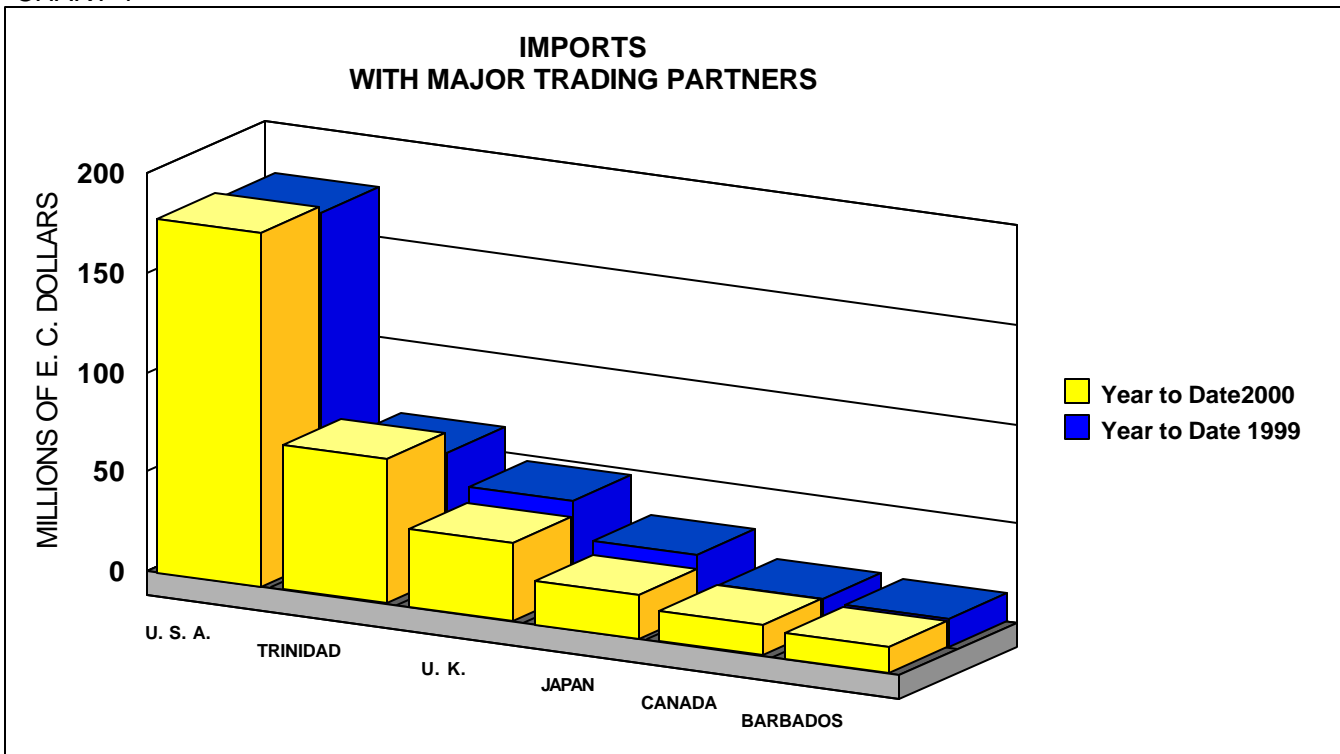

### CARICOM TRADE IMPORTS 2ND QUARTER 2000 & 1999

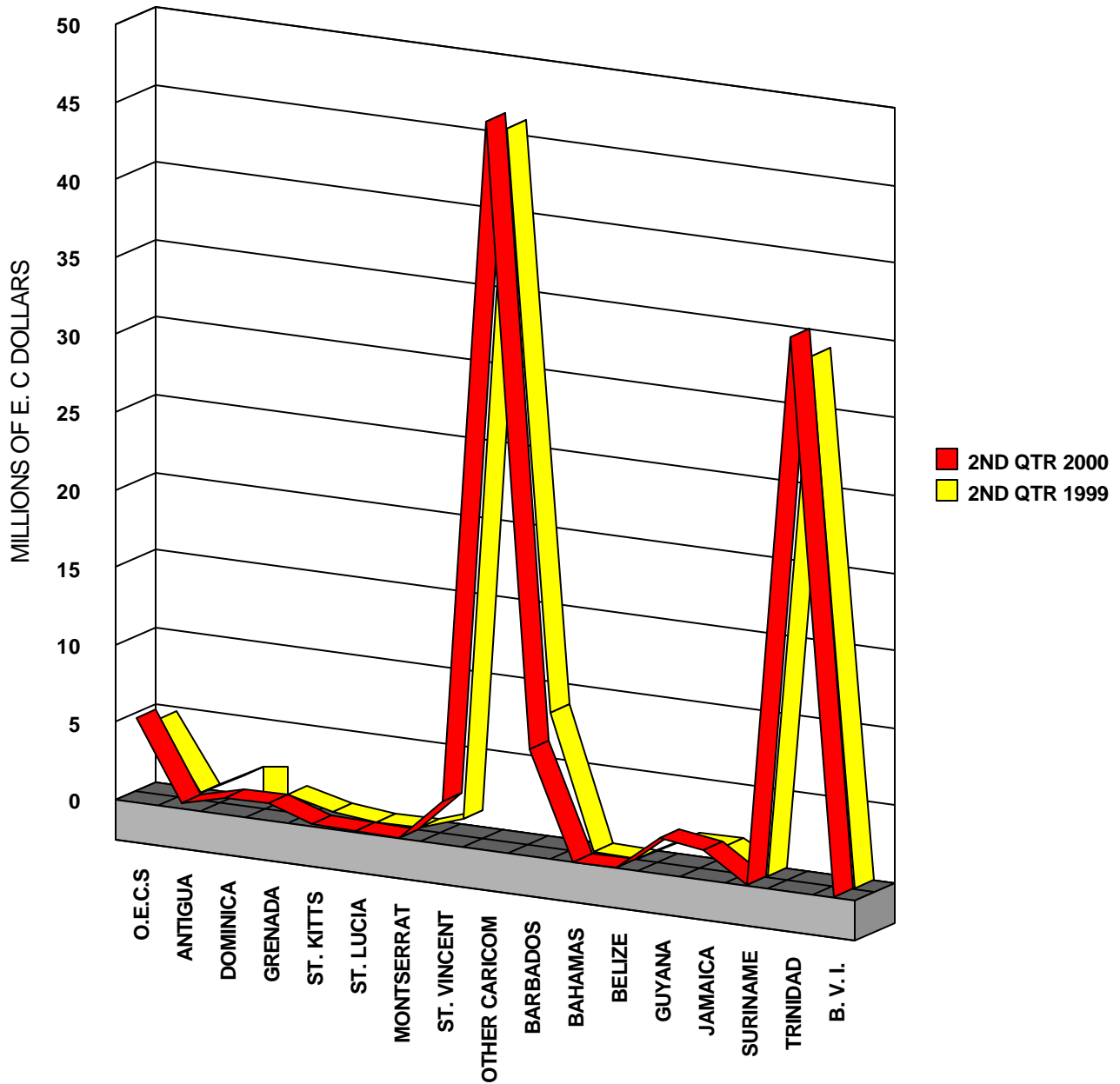
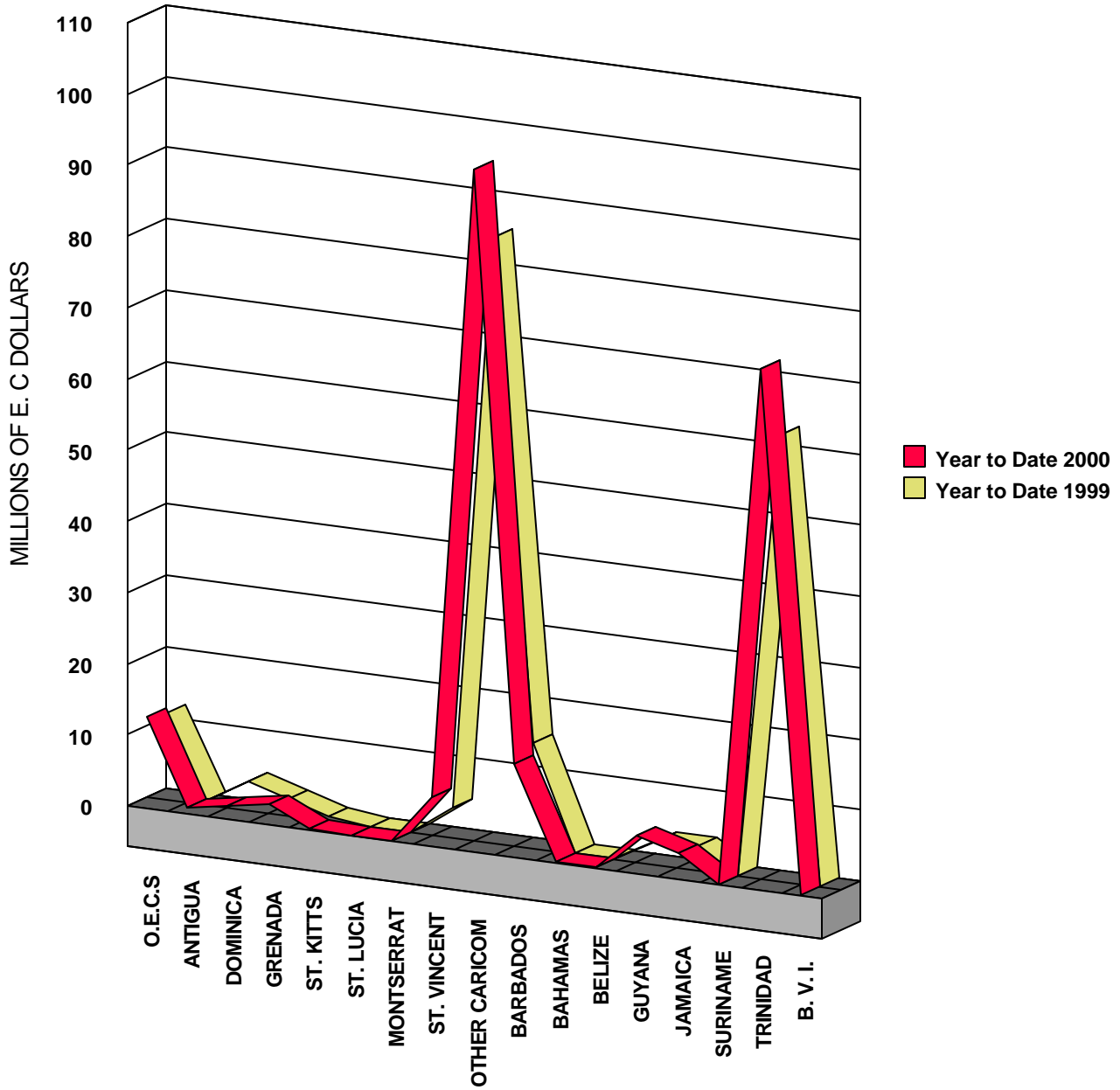

**Analysis of Trade**  
**For the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2000 compared to 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 1999**

**DOMESTIC EXPORTS**

In the second quarter of 2000, Domestic Exports were valued at 35 million EC Dollars. This figure represents a substantial decrease of 6 million EC Dollars, when compared with the Domestic Exports value recorded in 1999's second quarter. However, the value of Domestic Exports for the second quarter of 2000 was 5 million EC Dollars over that value in 2000's first quarter. For the year-to-date period January 2000 to June 2000, the Domestic Exports value was 64 million EC Dollars, an amazing 22 percentage points lower than the Domestic Exports value for the corresponding period of 1999. The above stated second quarter and year-to-date contractions reflect the striking reduction in the value of Domestic Exports falling in the SITC category, Food and Live Animals. When comparing the second quarters of 1999 and 2000, the value of Domestic Exports comprising the Food and Live Animals SITC class, contracted by 24%, from a value of 30 million EC Dollars, in 1999, to a one of just over 22 million EC Dollars, in 2000. To a lesser extent, Domestic Exports value reductions in the SITC sections of Crude Materials, Inedible, except Fuels, Animal and Vegetable Oils, Fats and Waxes, Manufactured Goods Classified Chiefly by Material and Miscellaneous Manufactured Articles, also contributed to the contractions in the overall second quarter and year-to-date Domestic Exports values. For the second quarter of 2000, there were Domestic Exports value expansions in only three of the nine SITC classes, namely Beverages and Tobacco, Chemicals and Related Products, N.E.S. and Machinery and Transport Equipment. Sadly, none of these expansions achieved any degree of significance and are unworthy of further comment.

On the regional scene, Barbados continued to receive more Domestic Exports than any other CARICOM country. In the second quarter of 2000, Barbados got 39% of all Domestic Exports sent to the CARICOM region, an increase of 7 percent over that percentage documented in 1999's second quarter. As other major recipients of Domestic Exports, Antigua and Barbuda and Grenada respectively acquired 17% and 12% of

domestic merchandise exported to CARICOM, in 2000's second quarter. For this period, Trinidad and Tobago, as the largest contributor to CARICOM Imports into Saint Lucia, received a mere 2% of Domestic Exports to CARICOM. This percentage represents a dramatic decline of 17 percentage points in Trinidad and Tobago's share of Domestic Exports to CARICOM, when comparing the second quarters of 1999 and 2000.

In the second quarter of 2000, Extra-regional Domestic Exports were received mostly by the United Kingdom, who got a whopping 79% of Domestic Exports to countries outside the CARICOM region. However, this percentage is 7 percent lower than the 86% documented in 1999's second quarter. The United States of America, the Total Imports and Extra-regional Imports market leader, acquired 14% of Extra-regional Domestic Exports and 10% of all Domestic Exports.

2ND QUARTER 2000 & 1999

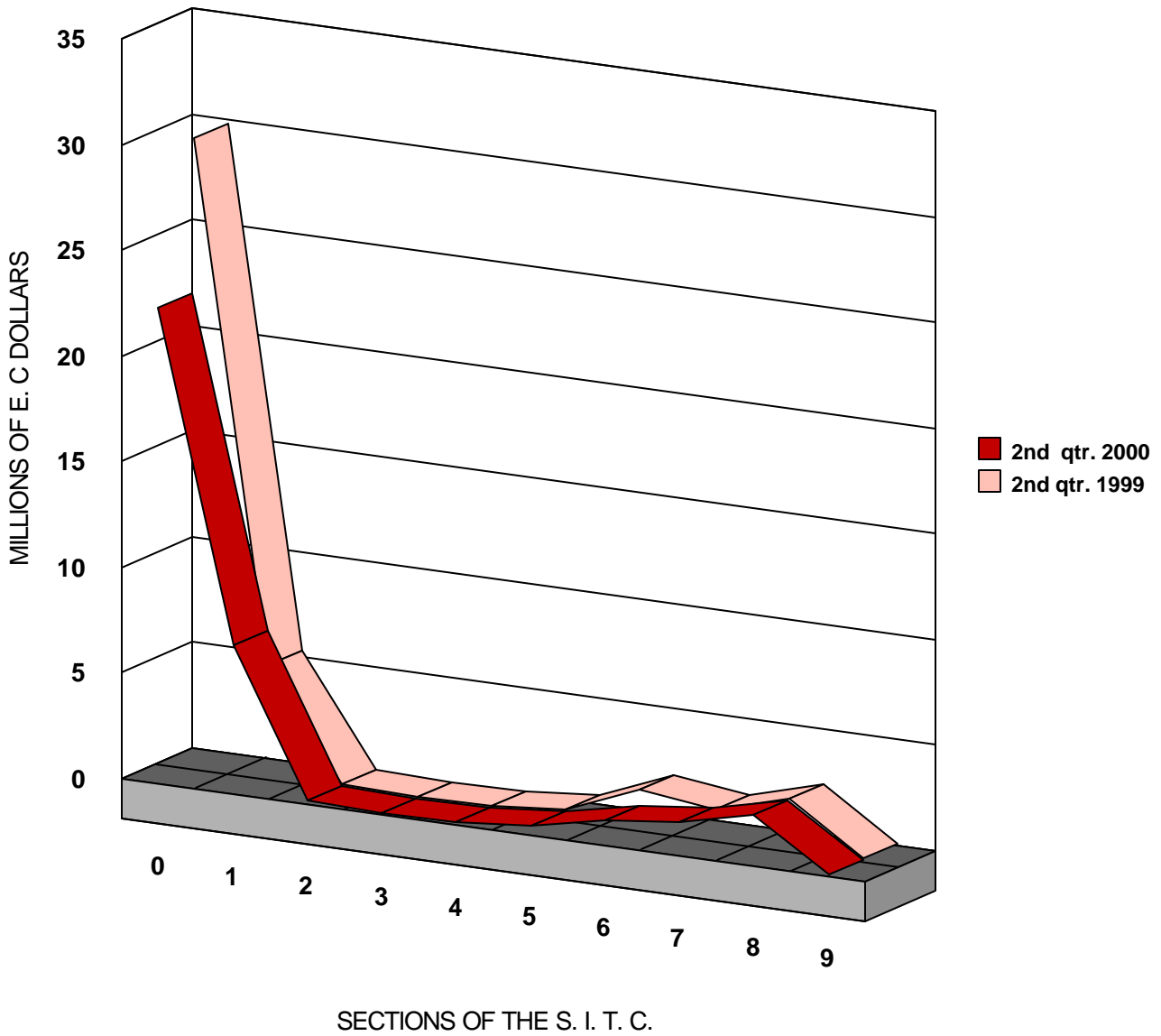
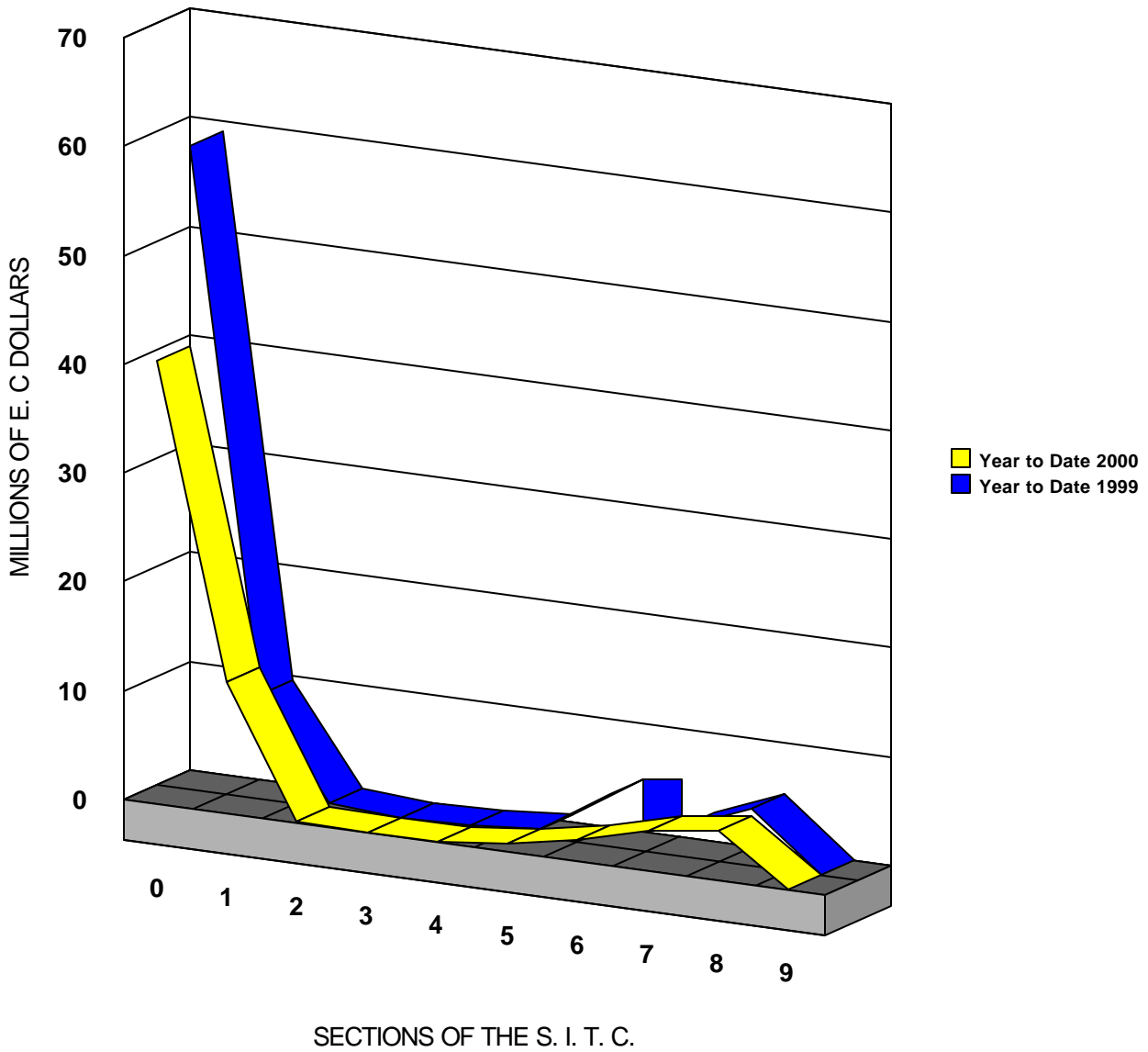
