## EXPLANATORY NOTES AND DEFINITIONS

**Source:** The Statistics published in this report are primarily obtained from the Customs Warrants submitted to the Customs and Excise Department on the Importation and Exportation of Goods. These Warrants are coded and batched in the Trade Section of the Statistics Department before being processed by the same Department. This report is then prepared from the computer printout.

**Period Covered:** This report covers all documents relating to Trade brought into account during the Calendar Year, January - December, 2000 on a Quarterly basis.

**Trade Classification:** The classification of goods is based on the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC) Revised 3 issued by the United Nations Economic and Social Council. This system of classification has been in operation from April 1991 and replaces the second Revision, which came into effect in January 1981.

**System of Trade:** The "Special Trade" is the system of coverage in this report i.e.

- (a) Imports represent the total of all imports cleared by the Customs for the local economy, and excludes all imports remaining under the control of the Customs Authority in Bonded Warehouses.
- (b) Exports represent the exports of all Domestic Produce and the Re-export<sup>1</sup> of imported goods which have previously been cleared from Customs control for the local economy. Imported goods which are re-exported directly from bonded warehouses are excluded.

**Values:** All values are shown in Eastern Caribbean Dollars (EC\$). Imports are valued c.i.f. , i.e. the value, insurance, freight and incidental charges up to the time of delivery at the port.

Exports are valued f.o.b., i.e. the value includes charges up to the time of delivery on board the exporting vessel or aircraft.

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<sup>1</sup> Goods brought into the country for temporary use, with the intention to be returned or exported back to the country of origin.

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## Analysis of Trade For the 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter of 2000 compared to 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter of 1999

### IMPORTS

Total Imports for the first quarter of 2000 was valued at 246,562,962 EC Dollars. This value followed the growing trend recorded between the corresponding quarters of 1998 and 1999, signifying an increase of 10.8% over the value recorded in the first quarter of 1999.

In the analysis of imports by the SITC, most noteworthy is the substantial expansion of imports falling in the category Machinery and Transport Equipment. In the first quarter of 2000, this class of imports was valued at just over 69 million EC Dollars, a value that represents an increase of 31.6% over the value recorded in the corresponding quarter in 1999. Machinery and Transport Equipment continued to dominate Saint Lucia's commodity importation, comprising 28.1% of the quarter's Total Imports and securing the top position over the traditional principal contributors, Food and Live Animals (19.7% of Total Imports) and Manufactured Goods Classified Chiefly by Material (16.7% of Total imports). Also worthy of mention is the significant increase in imports of Mineral Fuels, Lubricants and Related Materials. This import category recorded an increase of 74.2%, the most significant movement of all the SITC sections. For the quarter, in general, there were import expansions in only two other SITC classes, Crude Materials, Inedible, Except Fuels and Miscellaneous Manufactured Articles; while moderate contractions were recorded in the remaining categories, including: Food and Live Animals, Beverages and Tobacco, Animal and Vegetable Oils, Fats and Waxes, Chemical and Related Products, N.E.S., Manufactured Goods Classified Chiefly by Material and Commodities and Transactions Not Classified According to Kind.

Imports from within the CARICOM region increased by 21.1%, when compared with the corresponding quarter of 1999. The figures reveal nothing unconventional, remaining well within expected magnitudes. Predictably, Trinidad and Tobago captured the highest percentage of CARICOM Imports, 66.4%. The country was also able to secure a higher share of regional imports, augmenting its contribution by 4.3 percentage points. Barbados, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Guyana and Grenada, as other major regional trading partners, also achieved moderate expansions of their traditional share of CARICOM Imports. However, the traditional contributions of Jamaica and Dominica both suffered decline. Imports from Dominica decreased by an amazing 66.5%. Suriname, normally a modest contributor, increased its value of imports from 100 EC Dollars (in the first quarter of 1999) to 84,742 EC Dollars, in the corresponding period of 2000.

The United States of America again dominated extra-regional imports, capturing 47.1% of the imports from outside the region. America's share of extra-regional imports fell, slightly, by 2.9%. The United Kingdom, Japan and Canada continued to be the other major extra-regional contributors. However these countries, like the United States, were unable to maintain the percentage contributions reported in the first quarter of 1999. The extra-regional imports shares of the United Kingdom, Japan and Canada experienced declines of 1.8%, 1.7% and 0.3%, respectively.

### IMPORTS 1ST QUARTER 2000 & 1999

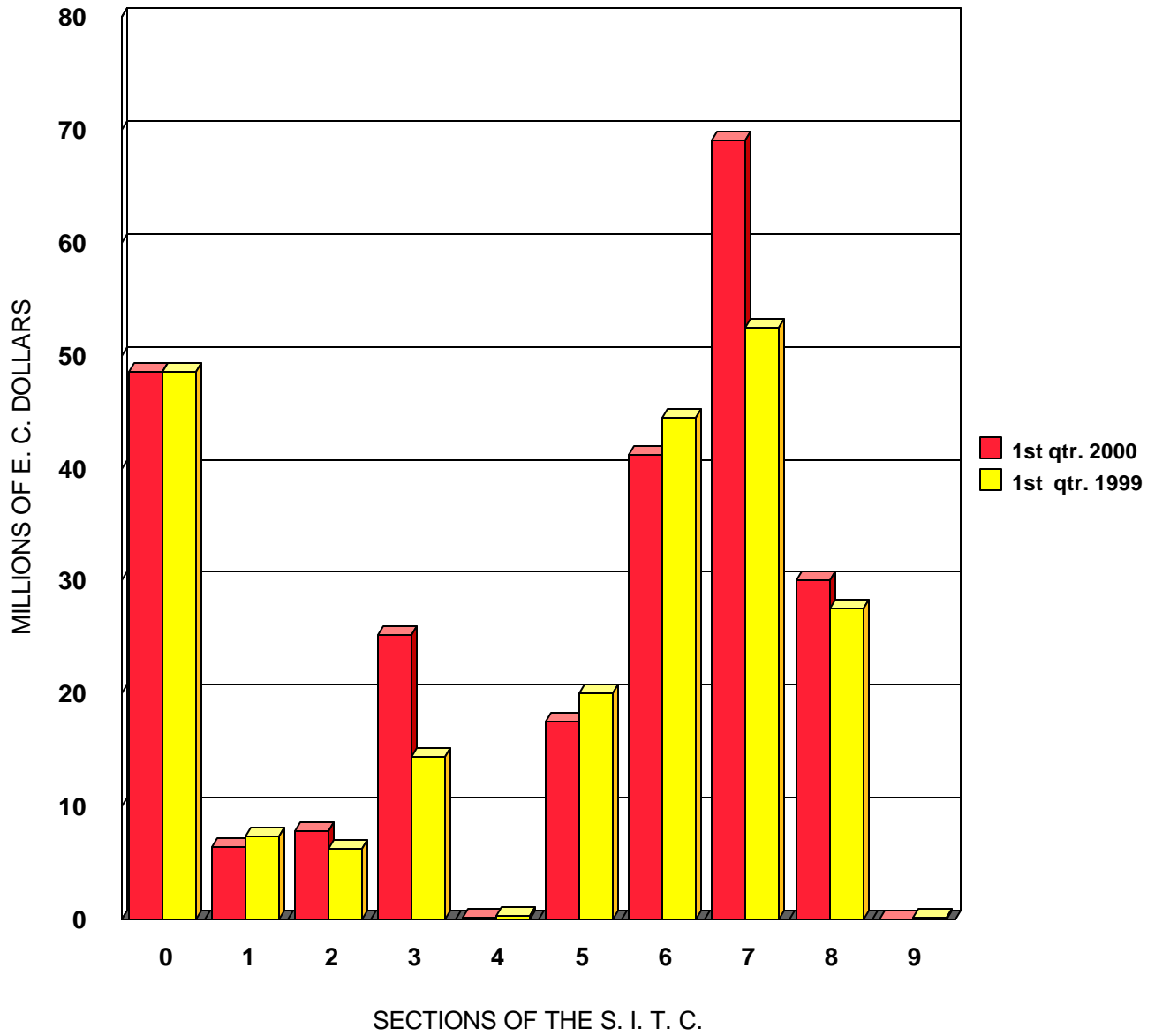

### IMPORTS WITH MAJOR TRADING PARTNERS 1ST QUARTER 2000 & 1999

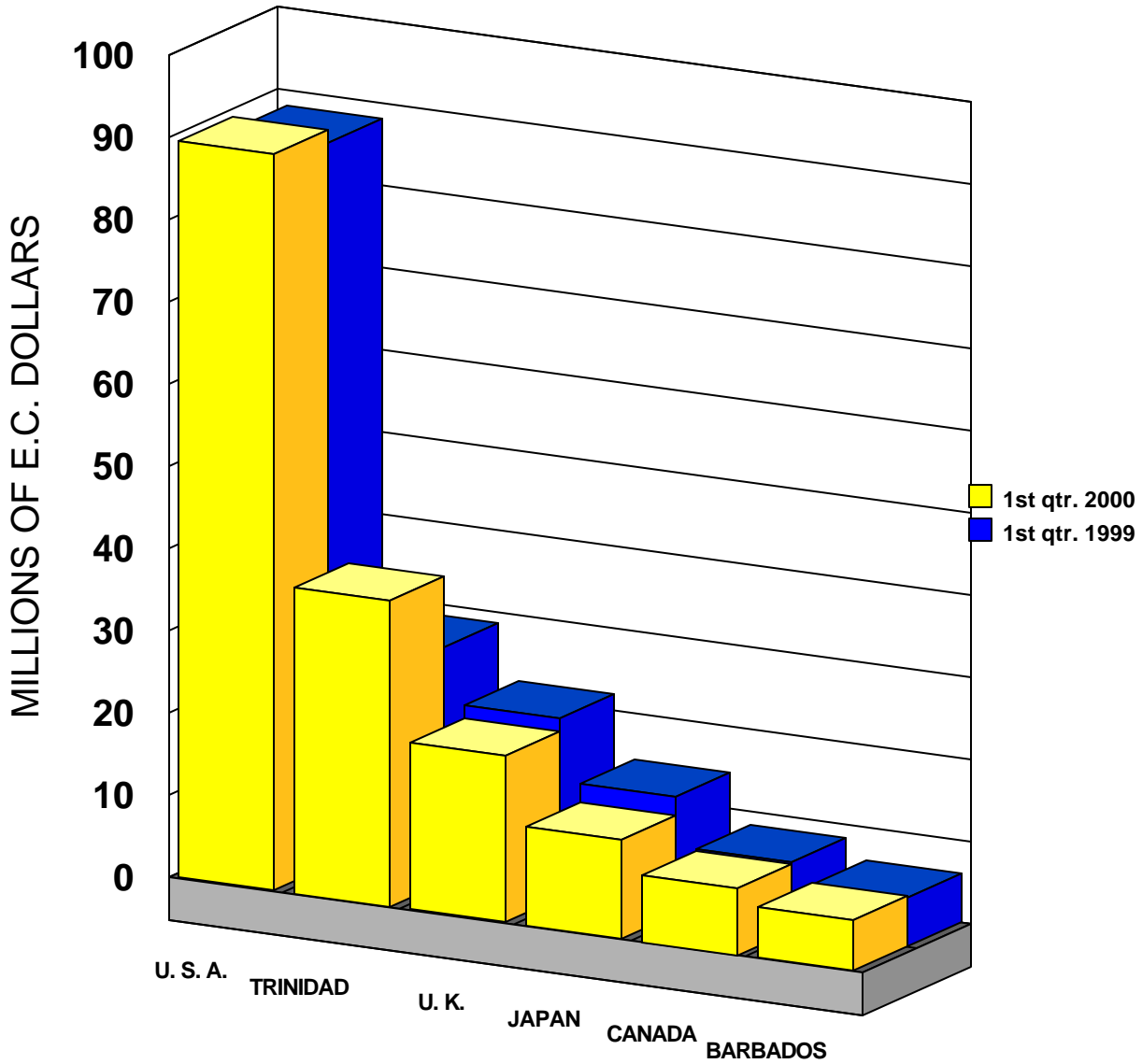
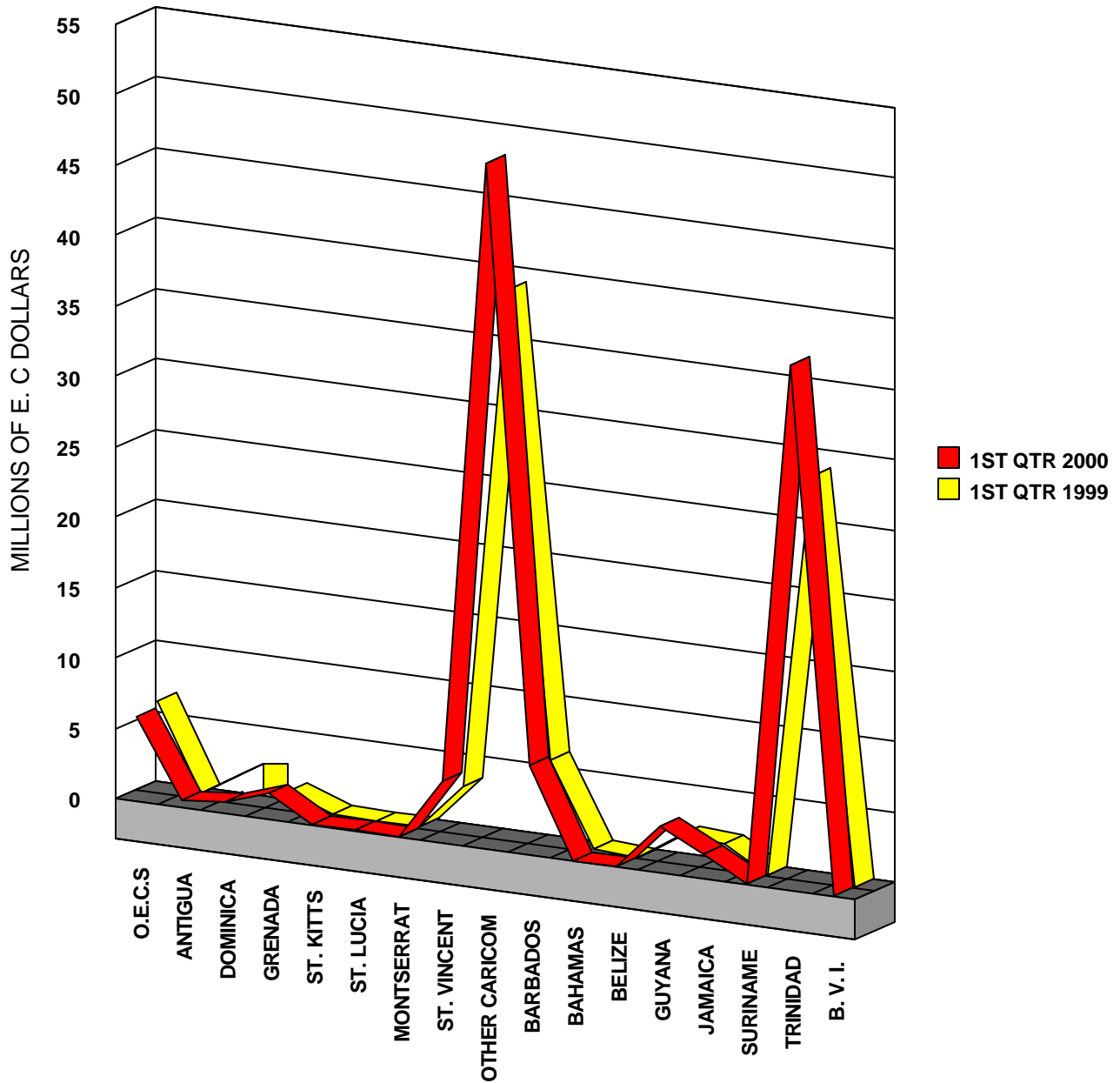

## Analysis of Trade For the 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter of 2000 compared to 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter of 1999

### DOMESTIC EXPORTS

Domestic Exports for the first quarter of 2000 was valued at approximately 29.4 million EC Dollars. This value corresponds to a dramatic decline of 29.1%, when compared with the equivalent period of 1999. The decline was largely the result of even more dramatic contractions of domestic exports of commodities falling in the SITC sections, Manufactured Goods Classified Chiefly by Material and Crude Materials, Inedible except Fuels. Domestic exports in these categories fell by astounding figures of 69.1% and 70.9%, respectively. Less significant decreases were recorded in three other SITC classes, including, Food and Live Animals, Chemicals and Related Products, N.E.S., and Miscellaneous Manufactured Articles. The declines outlined above were minimally offset by increases in the remaining SITC sections, Beverages and Tobacco, Animal and Vegetable Oils, Fats and Waxes and Machinery and Transport Equipment. These categories expanded by 19.5%, 14.9% and 66.1%, respectively.

Domestic exports to countries within the CARICOM region fell slightly, by 6.5%, from just over 7 million (in the first quarter of 1999) to approximately 6.5 million in the corresponding period of 2000. Exports to Barbados were valued at around 2.3 million EC Dollars, the highest export value recorded for the region. Other significant export values were accounted for by Antigua and Barbuda and Dominica. Exports to these two countries, along with Barbados, represented 68.0% of CARICOM exports. However, most notable was the considerable contraction of exports to Trinidad and Tobago, by an incredible 61.2%. Exports to Guyana and the British Virgin Islands also suffered relatively significant declines.

The United Kingdom maintained its traditional dominance of Saint Lucia's exports to countries outside the CARICOM region. Domestic exports to the United Kingdom were valued at 17.7 million EC Dollars; a value that accounts for 77.9% of extra-regional exports. However, this value is 6.1 percentage points lower than the 84.0% export share recorded for the United Kingdom in the first quarter of 1999. The enormous trade deficit with the United States continues to thrive. Whereas the United States controls 47.1% of extra-regional imports (the highest import share), the country accounts for only 19.3% of extra-regional domestic exports. Finally, it is interesting to note that the United Kingdom and the United States together receive a remarkable 97.2% of extra-regional domestic exports.

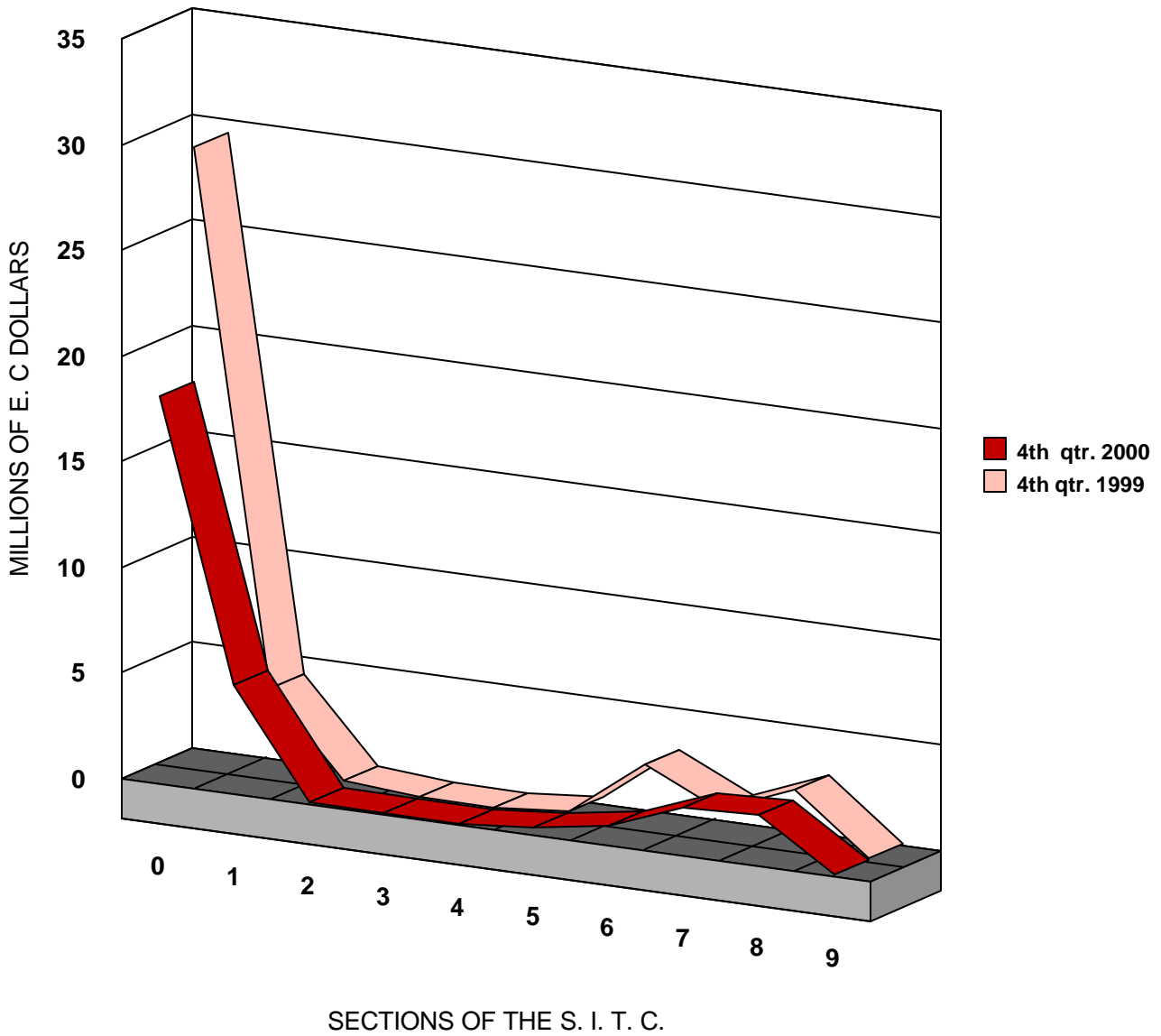
