## EXPLANATORY NOTES AND DEFINITIONS

**Source:** The Statistics published in this report are primarily obtained from the Customs Warrants submitted to the Customs and Excise Department on the Importation and Exportation of Goods. These Warrants are coded and batched in the Trade Section of the Statistics Department before being processed by the same Department. This report is then prepared from the computer printout.

**Period Covered:** This report covers all documents relating to Trade brought into account during the Calendar Year, January - December, 2000 on a Quarterly basis.

**Trade Classification:** The classification of goods is based on the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC) Revised 3 issued by the United Nations Economic and Social Council. This system of classification has been in operation from April 1991 and replaces the second Revision, which came into effect in January 1981.

**System of Trade:** The "Special Trade" is the system of coverage in this report i.e.

- (a) Imports represent the total of all imports cleared by the Customs for the local economy, and excludes all imports remaining under the control of the Customs Authority in Bonded Warehouses.
- (b) Exports represent the exports of all Domestic Produce and the Re-export<sup>1</sup> of imported goods which have previously been cleared from Customs control for the local economy. Imported goods which are re-exported directly from bonded warehouses are excluded.

**Values:** All values are shown in Eastern Caribbean Dollars (EC\$). Imports are valued c.i.f. , i.e. the value, insurance, freight and incidental charges up to the time of delivery at the port.

Exports are valued f.o.b., i.e. the value includes charges up to the time of delivery on board the exporting vessel or aircraft.

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<sup>1</sup> Goods brought into the country for temporary use, with the intention to be returned or exported back to the country of origin.

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## **Analysis of Trade For the 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter of 2002 compared to 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter of 2001**

### **IMPORTS**

Total Imports for the first quarter of 2002 was valued at 180.4 million EC Dollars. This value represents a decline of over 15%, when compared to the corresponding quarter of 2001.

The decline recorded for Total Imports is primarily the result of a substantial contraction of imports classified, according to the SITC, as Mineral Fuels, Lubricants and Related Materials. In this category, there was a decrease of just over 67%. Food and Live Animals dominated Saint Lucia's commodity importation, comprising 25% of the quarter's Total Imports and securing the top position over other principal contributors, including Manufactured Goods Classified Chiefly by Material (20% of Total imports) and Machinery & Transport Equipment (19.5% of Total Imports). For the first quarter of 2002, there were import contractions in 5 of the 10 SITC sections. The most significant increase was recorded in the SITC class Beverages and Tobacco. This class of imports was valued at 8.3 million EC Dollars, reflecting a percentage increase of 25% in comparison to the first quarter of 2001.

Imports from within the CARICOM region mirrored the aforementioned decline reported for Total Imports. CARICOM Imports decreased from 49.3 Million EC Dollars in the first quarter of 2001 to 39 Million EC Dollars in the matching quarter of 2002. Trinidad and Tobago continued to capture the highest percentage of Imports from CARICOM; an enormous 70%. However imports from that country fell, in value, by 20% when contrasting the first quarters of the years 2001 and 2002. Imports from St. Vincent and the Grenadines, a major regional trading partner, continued to suffer contraction and declined in value by 15%. Imports from most of the other major CARICOM trading partners, including Barbados and Guyana, also declined in value. However, there were slight value increases for imports from the CARICOM countries of Grenada, Jamaica, Suriname and The Bahamas.

The United States of America again dominated extra-regional imports but, like the major trading partners of CARICOM, experienced a significant value decline. The value of imports from the USA fell by 13%. Among the other major extra-regional contributors, Japan and Canada also experienced import value contractions. However, the United Kingdom was able to increase its imports from 16.9 million EC Dollars in the first quarter of 2001 to 20 million EC Dollars in 2002's corresponding quarter.

### IMPORTS 1ST QUARTER 2002 & 2001

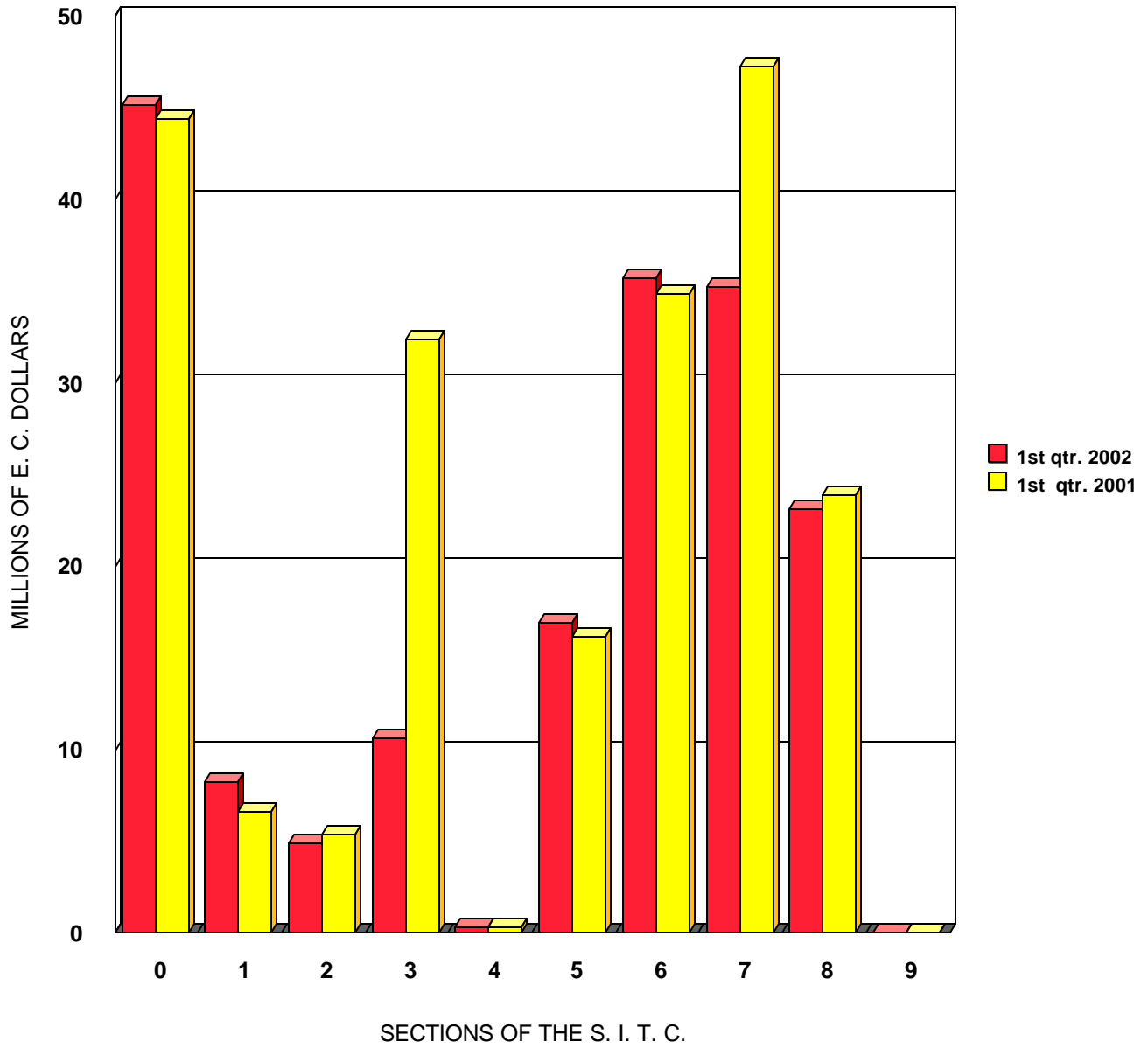

### IMPORTS WITH MAJOR TRADING PARTNERS 1ST QUARTER 2002 & 2001

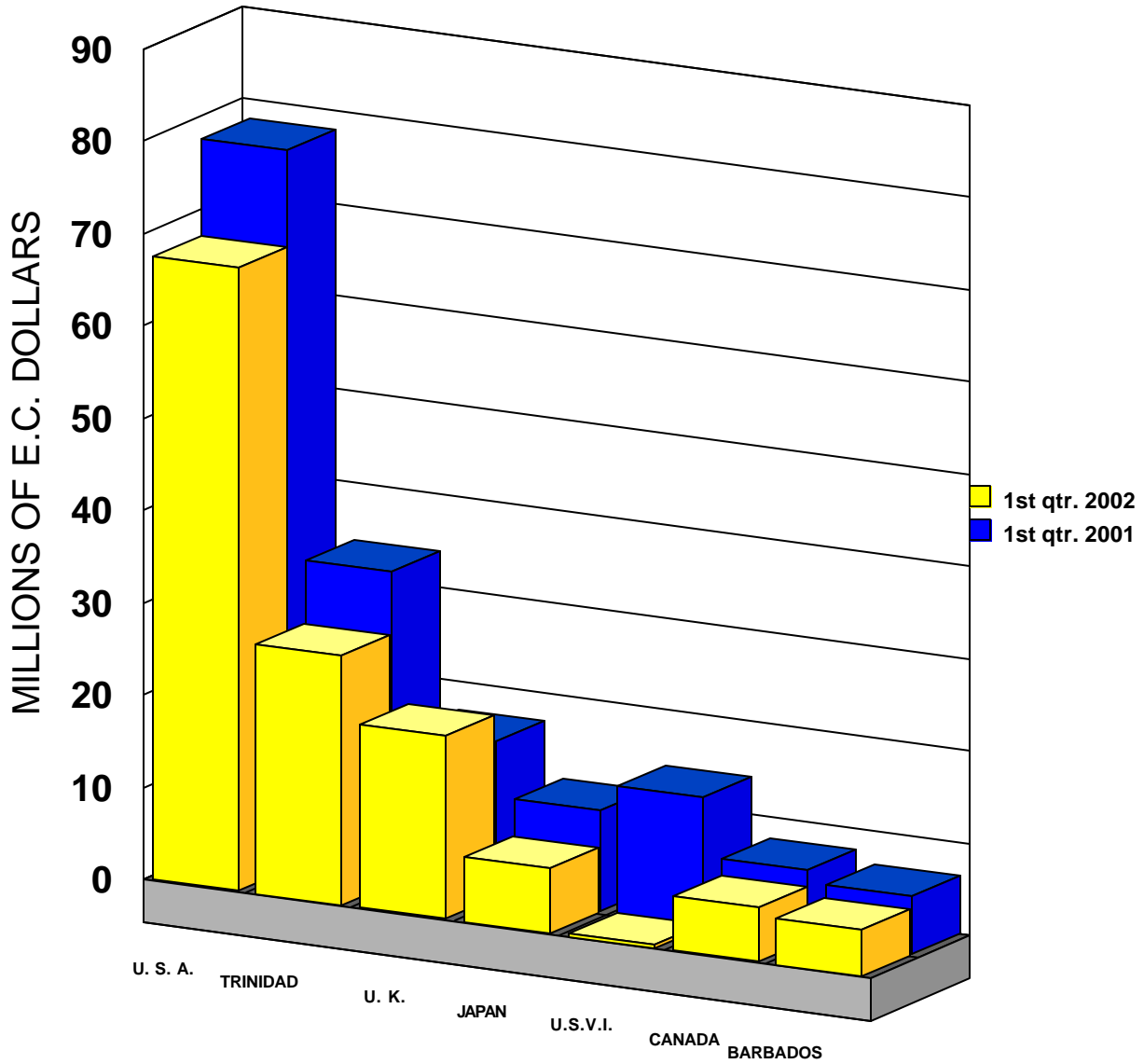
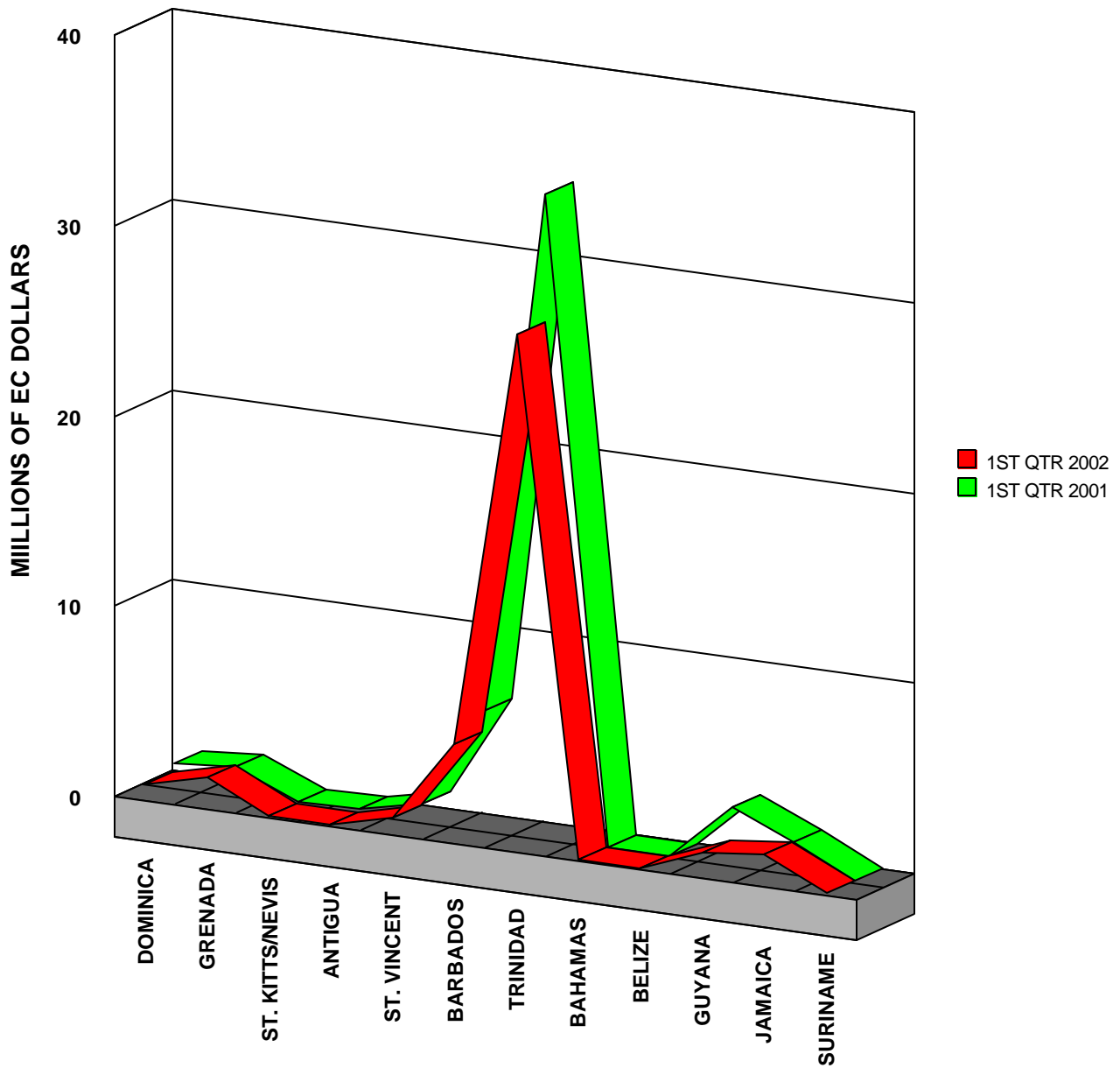

## **Analysis of Trade For the 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter 2002 compared to 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter 2001**

### **DOMESTIC EXPORTS**

In the first quarter of 2002, Domestic Exports were valued at 20.5 million EC Dollars. This figure signifies a contraction of 27.5 % when compared to the first quarter of 2001. Most of this contraction can be explained by the decline of domestic exports classified by the SITC as Food & Live Animals. This class of domestic exports suffered a value decrease of 40%, reflecting prolonged difficulties experienced in the local banana industry. The Food & Live Animals class of exports, in keeping with tradition, secured the greatest share of domestic exports, a share of 45 percent. Beverages and Tobacco and Manufactured Goods Classified Chiefly by Material recorded the next best domestic export shares of 25% and 14% respectively. Export value contractions were experienced in all the SITC classes with the exceptions of Animal and Vegetable Oils and Manufactured Goods Classified Chiefly by Material. However, these two SITC sections recorded only moderate increases in value.

On the regional scene, Barbados continued to accept more Domestic Exports than any other CARICOM country. In the first quarter of 2002, Barbados received 38% of all Domestic Exports shipped to the CARICOM region. However, most worthy of mention is the dramatic increase in Domestic Exports to Dominica. In the first quarter of 2002, Domestic Exports to Dominica were valued at 2.5 million EC Dollars. This value contrasts with that of just over 700 thousand EC Dollars, which was recorded in the first quarter of 2001. No significant developments were experienced in the export trade with the other CARICOM nations.

In contrasting the first quarters of 2002 and 2001, Domestic Exports to the United Kingdom continued the downward trend that was revealed in earlier first quarter comparisons. The value of Domestic Exports to the United Kingdom fell by 42%. The United States of America received 2.6 million EC Dollars worth of Domestic Exports, a decline of 45%.

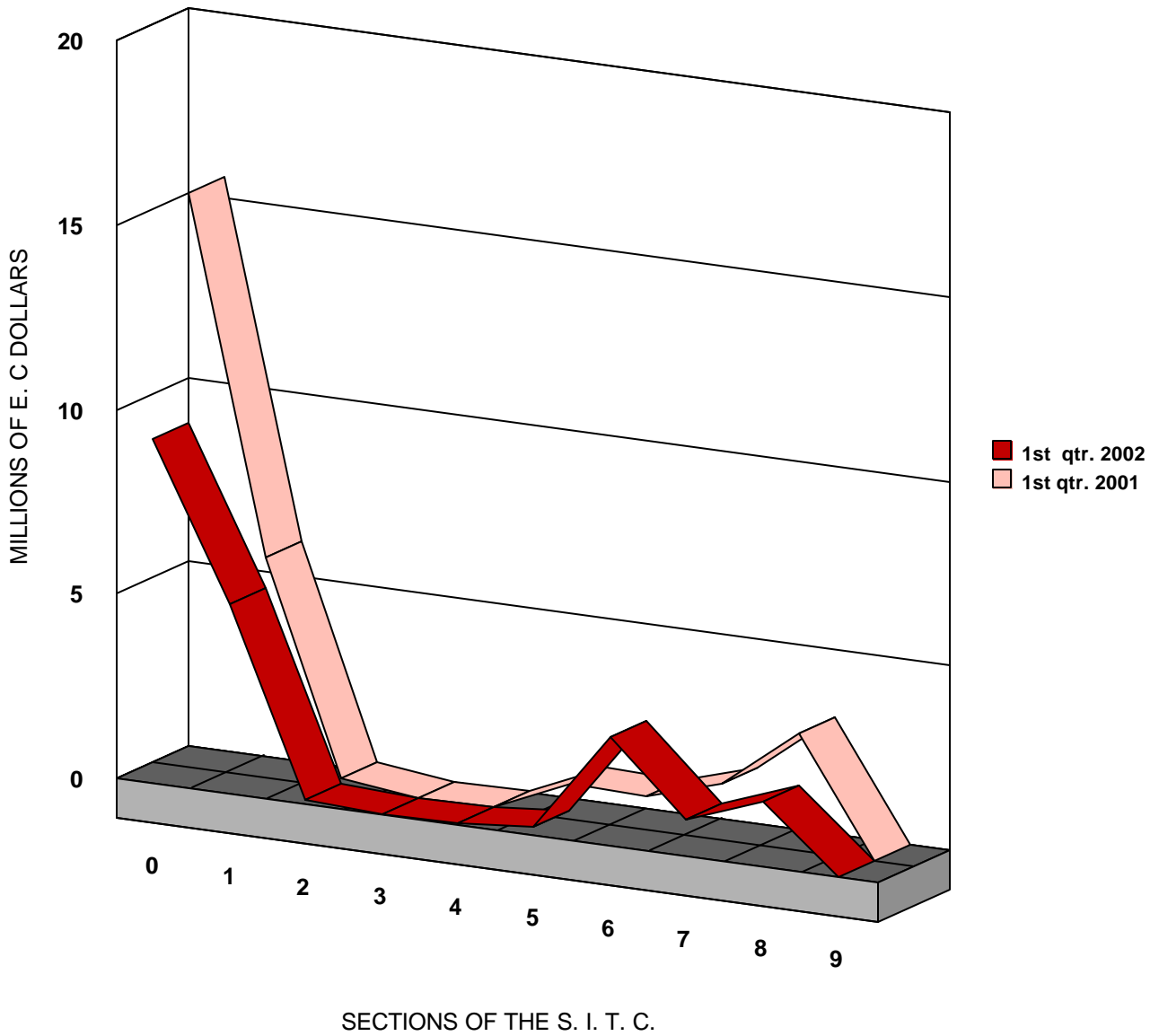
