

### ACCESS TO BASIC FOOD AND NON FOOD NEEDS

Since the COVID-19 outbreak, a significant number of households, especially the poor, reported limited access to food and basic services.

### FOOD SECURITY

Limited food availability caused households to become more food insecure post-COVID, with poor households twice as likely to run out of food as compared to non-poor households
